Submission Guidelines:

I cordially extend an invitation for you to submit an article for volume one of *Ars Nummorum et Eorum Fontium* (ANF). This exciting project is spearheaded by myself, who will serve as managing editor in chief of the series. Likewise serving as a managing editor is Jack Koziol, (soon-to-be) member of the American Numismatic Society Advisory Board. We are also excited to announce that joining us in the same role is Nick Vaneerdewegh, Conservator of the Department of Coins & Medals of the Royal Library of Belgium. The ANF is a new journal geared towards publishing ancient and medieval coin literature via a bi-yearly compendium. The ANF will be offered both for free online and available as a physical copy for purchase at the cost of printing.

General formatting guidelines are as follows:

- A topic that relates to ancient or medieval numismatics or sigillography
- Paper length as appropriate to topic
 - For articles 45 pages or longer, consideration will be given for a monograph
- Times New Roman, 12 point font.
- 1.0 sentence spacing
- Article submitted in both a Word document and PDF
- Images must be captioned with original source given
- Images should be formatted as JPEGs or PNGs

Bibliographic guidelines are as follows:

Books

- Author last name, first name (year). *Title of Book*. Publisher, City.

Articles

- Author last name, first name (year). 'Title of Article', *Title of Journal*, Volume Number, Page Numbers. Publisher, City.

Footnotes

- Author last name (year), pg. X.
- Author last name (year), pgs. X-X.

Images

- Source, reference number. Description of image (diameter in mm. and weight in g.).
