## **Submission Guidelines:**

I cordially extend an invitation for you to submit an article for volume one of *Ars Nummorum et Eorum Fontium* (ANF). This exciting project is spearheaded by myself, who will serve as managing editor in chief of the series. Likewise serving as a managing editor is Jack Koziol, (soon-to-be) member of the American Numismatic Society Advisory Board. We are also excited to announce that joining us in the same role is Nick Vaneerdewegh, Conservator of the Department of Coins & Medals of the Royal Library of Belgium. The ANF is a new journal geared towards publishing ancient and medieval coin literature via a bi-yearly compendium. The ANF will be offered both for free online and available as a physical copy for purchase at the cost of printing.

## General formatting guidelines are as follows:

- A topic that relates to ancient or medieval numismatics or sigillography
- Paper length as appropriate to topic
  - o For articles 45 pages or longer, consideration will be given for a monograph
- Times New Roman, 12 point font.
- 1.0 sentence spacing
- Article submitted in both a Word document and PDF
- Images must be captioned with original source given
- Images should be formatted as JPEGs or PNGs

# Bibliographic guidelines are as follows:

### **Books**

• Author last name, first name (year). *Title of Book*. Publisher, City.

#### Articles

• Author last name, first name (year). 'Title of Article', *Title of Journal*, Volume Number, Page Numbers. Publisher, City.

#### **Footnotes**

- Author last name (year), pg. X.
- Author last name (year), pgs. X-X.

## **Images**

• Source, reference number. Description of image (diameter in mm. and weight in g.).

Many current publications require a 2-5 year abstinence in the reproduction of an article by its author after publication in the journal, if ever returning reproduction ownership. Unlike existing journals, the ANF does not retain exclusive reproduction rights to articles after publication date. Thus, any author who publishes with the ANF is free to distribute their work at will **after publication date**, including on archive websites such as Academia.edu! The ANF provides a venue for publications that both follow expectations of academic publishing (DOI and ISSN) while returning full control of intellectual work to the author. By submitting your article to the ANF, you agree to not reproduce the information contained therein until after the publication of the ANF volume, at which point you are free to do as you wish with your article.
